



Prevalence of Current Smoking Among All Adults and Adults in Demographic Groups with High Smoking Rates in NYS






The Problem of Flavored Tobacco, Including Menthol

- Flavored tobacco products appeal to young people and cigars sell for as little as 5 for \$1
- More than 80% of young people who ever used tobacco started with a **flavored** tobacco product.⁶
- 86% of Black smokers use menthol cigarettes vs. 36% of White smokers.⁷

The tobacco industry has heavily marketed menthol cigarettes to African American communities resulting in increased use of a product that makes it easier to start smoking and harder to quit.
